While the Feast of St. Francis is celebrated on Monday the 4th, on Sunday we hold a memorial of the passing of St. Francis from this life to the next. On the night Francis died, Oct. 3, 1228, his brothers moved his body from where it lay to the chapel he rebuilt, the Portiuncula, this first transition ("Transitus" in Italian) was the foundation of a tradition that became an annual event beginning in the 1600's.

Over the years, communities have incorporated elements from the many narratives surrounding the passing of St. Francis, the leave taking of Francis, the reading of John's Gospel on the washing of the apostles' feet, Psalm 142 and the exhortation and blessing of the brothers.

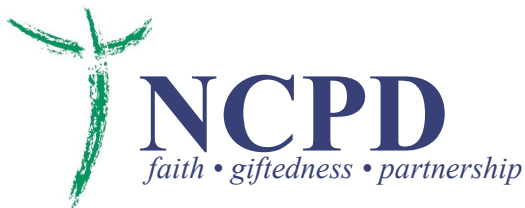

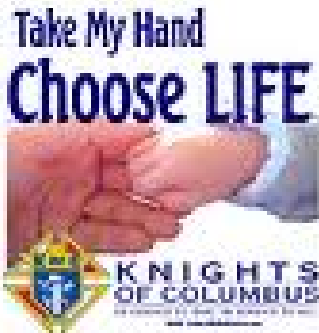
